Throw in some carving and you have LETTERBOXING! Letterboxing is an intriguing pastime combining navigational skills and rubber stamp artistry in a charming "treasure hunt" style outdoor quest. A wide variety of adventures can be found to suit all ages and experience levels. Come learn how! (Secrist) **** Fee of \$1-\$5 may be required for hands-on supplies.**

402: Crafty Recycling of our Recyclables – Taking all of your scrap and recyclable items and turning them into something useful instead of sending it to the landfill! Great ideas for den or pack activities. (Turpin)

403: A Scout is Reverent – A Look at the Religious Program - My Duty to God in the den, in the pack, at home and away. Consider the possibilities. (Keirstead)

404: Technology Skills / A look at Craftsman - Participants will be presented practical project ideas and plans for this Technology Skills Activity Badge. We'll cover which requirements are most suitable for Den Meeting, utilizing outside resources, and introducing Webelos to the wonders of hands on construction. (Simon)

405: Leave No Trace for Cub Scouts – Learn activities that will teach Leave No Trace concepts to Cub Scouts of all ranks in fun, interactive ways. (Lutsch) *New*

406: Games & Stories – Ever find yourself in the situation where you need to turn 10 minutes of free time into a GREAT time with Cubs? Do you know how to keep the eyes and ears of your Cubs tuned in on your every word? 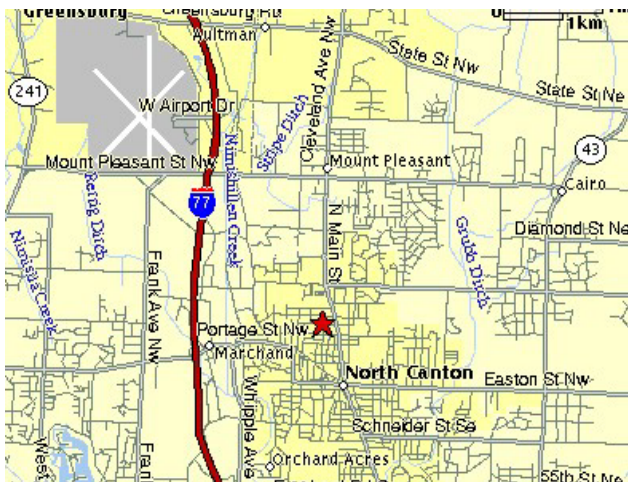

From Interstate 77: Take Portage Street/Canal Fulton Exit 111 (from the south, turn right off exit) (from the north, turn left off the exit). Travel on Portage Street (approx. 1 mile) to Pierce Ave NW. Turn left and follow (approx. 1/3 mile) to 9th Street. Turn right on 9th Street NW. Faith United Methodist Church is on the right. You can enter the parking lot on 9th at the Faith Friends Pre-School or off of Hillcrest Ave. NW.

From Alliance: Take Route 62 west towards Canton, take the Interstate 77 directions. OR you can take Route 62 West to the Cleveland Ave./30th Street exit. Go North on Cleveland Avenue towards North Canton. Cleveland will become South Main at Everhard Rd. and then it will become North Main around Maple. Keep going till you get to 9th Street NW (on the left). If you get to Applegrove, you went too far. Turn left onto 9th Street. Faith United Methodist Church is on the left. You may enter the parking lot off of Hillcrest or off of 9th Street at the Faith Friends Pre-School.
